Brother Edik is not actually hearing a voice. Instead, he is having thoughts about what he thinks his father would say to him if he could see how he is behaving. Brother Edik's father has really caused him to suffer from self-confidence issues. His self-esteem suffers from the repeated negative things his father said to him as he was growing up.

Note: This is often how authors set up a character that will go through a character change due to events that take place in the novel. Ask students if they think Brother Edik will go through an event in which he will have to show he is brave. If so, what could it be? Will he save Beatryce from the evil king?
