Location of the Story

Zoe's party is held in Beacon Hill which she describes as her favorite neighborhood in Boston.

Zoe's family lives in a duplex (two-family home).

A reader can infer that Zoe attends Medford Middle School because of the t-shirt that Trevor wears.

Importance of the Setting

The setting is ideal for a realistic fiction novel. Actual places are mentioned adding to the realism of the story.

Beacon Hill is a real neighborhood in Boston. You will find the cobblestone streets that Zoe describes there.

Readers can infer Zoe comes from a middle-class family based on the description of her home. She lives in a duplex. Patricia, the mother that lives next door, is a nurse.

Setting

Time of the Story

The novel is set in present day. It mentions the kid baking competiton on the Food Network that first aired in 2015. The novel was published on January 14, 2021. This narrows the actual date down to a 6 year span.

Mood - Atmosphere of the Setting

Complications are already beginning to arise. Zoe is mad at Trevor who lives in the other half of her duplex. His proximity will likely add to the complications presented in the story.

Zoe receives a letter from her father who is in prison at the Massachusetts State Penitentiary. (Although the book does not say this, this prison is in Concord which is only a 30 minute drive from Boston. This makes the trip short enough for Zoe to travel there if Zoe decides to do this.)




Important Update




