In the year 1888, there was a big snowstorm that came to the Great Plains of the United States. The storm happened on a school day, and many children were caught in it on their way home from school.

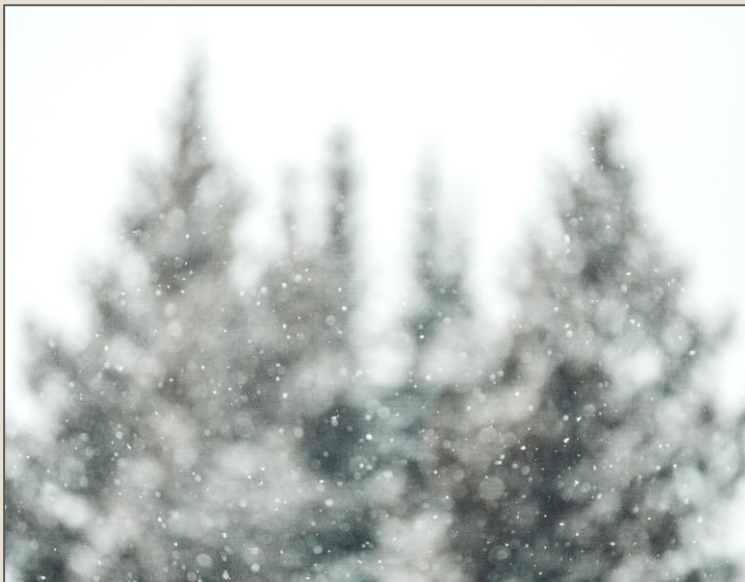

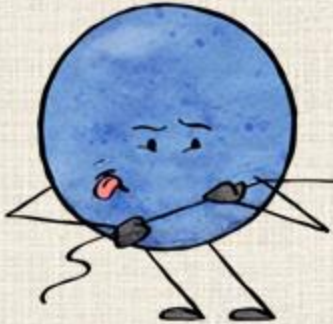
