
Comparing the Book to the Movie Organizer


Two versions of the first page of the organizer are provided depending on the needs of your students.

- Students will come up with their own categories for book and movie differences.
- ❖ The book and movie differences categories are provided.

Instructions:

- 1) Simply copy the first page of the organizer onto colored paper.
- 2) Copy the next onto white copier paper. Note: If students need additional writing space, several copies of this page may be glued together to form a book.
- 3) Trim the outer edges so the organizer will fit into interactive notebooks.
- 4) The first colored page should be cut on the line between the flaps up to the dotted fold line, so that it will open one flap at a time.
- 5) Students will complete the organizer by filling in the missing information.
- 6) Glue the pages together down the middle in the place labeled.







You can stack together as many pages as needed to add extra details. This organizer contains three information pages stacked together.
